If you are a property owner in Wisconsin, you are entitled to utilize public library services at the **Irvin L. Young Memorial Library at 431 West Center Street in Whitewater.** In addition to great recreational reads, they also have many books on gardening, DIY projects, cooking, etc. and audiobooks in both compact disc format and Playaways, a new medium that allows you to listen without owning an additional device to play it. They also carry DVDs and music compact discs in all genres. Heirloom seeds for vegetables, fruits, flowers, and herbs are available for you to plant, you can check out GPS devices for navigating in area parks. They also have a makerspace where you can get die-cut quilting pieces and paper crafts, digitize family photos and videocassettes, and even create custom cookie cutters on their 3D plastic printer. For a library card you need only a current photo I.D. and proof of Wisconsin address, such as a utility bill.

"Slow-No Wake" means a speed at which a vessel moves as slowly as possible while still maintaining steering control.

A PWC may not be operated at faster than "slow, no wake speed" within:

- 100 feet of any other vessel on any body of water
- 200 feet of shore on any lake
- 100 feet of a dock, pier, raft, or restricted area on any lake

Persons operating a boat with skiers or any other water sport must operate in a counterclockwise pattern on both lakes and inlet and outlet in the traffic lane.

For safety sake, if you are swimming, docking or floating on the lakes – try and stay inside the buoys – you will be safer and not in the boating traffic lanes.
