Bog is up on both Rice and Whitewater Lakes, take care as you boat to give plenty of space between your boat and the bog. Bog is like an iceberg – sometimes what you see is only a portion of it.



Even when the buoys are removed for the season “No person may operate a motorboat within 100 feet of any dock, raft, pier, or buoyed restricted area on any lake at a speed in excess of slow-no-wake.

No person may operate a personal watercraft at a speed in excess of slow-no-wake within 200 feet of the shoreline of any lake.” These laws protect swimmers, other boaters and our shoreline. Please share this information with all boaters using your equipment or anyone you see dropping a boat into our lakes. The water level is extremely high and our shorelines are impacted by the boat waves – please be considerate of the riparian owners – restacking their shoreline is a hefty bill.

We strongly discourage dumping leaves and grass clippings into a lake, river, wetland, or other body of water. Leaves, grass clippings and similar debris add potassium to the water that use up precious oxygen as they decompose. Some aquatic organisms like fish and native plants need that oxygen and high levels of potassium increase algae and algae blooms in the lakes. If you'd like to be a good steward of our water and land resources, the best way to dispose of leaves and similar waste is to compost it either on your land, or at a designated compost site near you.
